




April City Council Updates

Don't miss the opportunity to exercise your vote and make your voice heard. Here are the offices that will be on your ballot:


- **Federal:** United States Senate & Congress

FYI: Temporary River Road Detour Coming Soon

Wanted to share this info for the upcoming River Road closure scheduled for April 18th (weather-dependent)! Also good to know:

- There will be no closures on SR-32
- This utility work is being done as a part of the upgrades coming to the SR-32/River Road and SR-32/SR-38 intersections



Update: Bridge of Flowers

As many of you may know, the City is partnering with the County and the Gordon Family to beautify the Logan Street pedestrian bridge over the White River. The partnership will result in a fully-activated bridge, helping to accomplish an overarching goal to better connect the East and West side of the White River.

- **Initial prep work** could begin taking place in May, followed by **construction in June**.
- There will be a **temporary, month-long lane restriction on Logan Street** during construction in June. During this period, one lane

of Logan will be closed (still having one lane each way open over the bridge).

- **Construction impacts to the roadway bridge will not begin until after June 6th** so Noblesville Race Weekend (Darlington Bed Race, Main Street Duck Race, and more) can move forward without a hitch!
- Since the construction timeline is compact, the **targeted completion of the Bridge of Flowers should be by July 4th**. The planting of annuals by the “Bridge of Flowers” group will be scheduled around this final date!

Speed Limit & Intersection Updates

Every year, the Engineering Department presents amendments to the traffic schedule ordinance (speed limits, restricted parking, intersections, etc.) to Council for its approval.

A few highlights:

- **The temporary 4-way stop at 9th & Wayne (put in for construction of the County garage) will become permanent.**

- The ordinance **will lower the speed limit of Allisonville Road from Wellington Parkway to Christian Street to 30 mph.** With the upcoming addition of Allisonville Trail adjacent to this roadway, this corridor is transforming to a more urban, walkable environment. This area will have narrower lanes with an 8' asphalt path on the east side upon completion.
- A “No Left Turn” restriction will be included for westbound traffic at the intersection of Maple Street and 8th Street

Infrastructure Spotlight: 10th Street Trail


If you've recently driven south on 10th Street/ Allisonville Road, you may have noticed construction south of the roundabout near the Pizza King. This is a strategic project the City is undertaking to increase pedestrian connectivity, slow traffic, and address needed drainage improvements.

Once completed, there will be an 8-foot wide asphalt trail heading north from Wellington Parkway of the Wellington Northeast subdivision to the 5-point roundabout at Greenfield Ave.

TIMELINE: Project has been bid and awarded, with an anticipated completion of November of this year.

During construction of the new storm sewer and water line upgrades (paid by the water company), south bound 10th Street will be detoured to 8th Street while northbound 10th Street will remain on 10th Street (Allisonville Road). The contractor started on work earlier this month and the work will include a lane restriction set to begin April 18 and last 60 days.
