COUNCIL UPDATE

Due to the outbreak of COVID-19, the Council's last meeting was held via teleconference. We had a robust conversation about the virus and voted unanimously to strengthen the City's emergency response and direct the public to follow guidelines issued by public health officials.

Note: These will be lifted when Governor Holcomb declares an end to the state public health emergency.

NOBLESVILLE SMALL BUSINESS GRANTS

Earlier this month, the Mayor and his team partnered with the Noblesville Chamber of Commerce and representatives from the City Council to create a grant helping small businesses with unmet immediate needs such as payroll, rent and utilities, and other expenses to remain operational and serve customers and clients.

Here's what you need to know:

- These grants were based on demonstrated need and provided up to \$10,000 per small business impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.
