Due to the outbreak of COVID-19, many of our meetings this spring were held via teleconference. We have, however, started meeting in city hall again. Northside Crime Watch

Earlier this week, I stopped by Northside Crime Watch with Councilor Darren Peterson and Police Chief John Mann to talk about the Police Department's [new initiative to equip our men and women in uniform with body worn cameras](#) before the end of the summer. This is a part of an ongoing commitment to increase transparency and effectiveness of community-based law enforcement and public safety efforts. While I was not on Council when funding for body worn cameras was introduced last year, I completely support this measure.

We also talked about the steps Noblesville is taking to support peaceful protests and the ways the City is partnering with organizations in our community to counteract the effects of COVID-19.

As our community continues to dive into tough and necessary conversations about race, the City of Noblesville has dedicated a spot on the website to help. I've found these resources to be helpful in conversations with those around me, and I hope they are helpful to you too.
